What are Dividends?

A dividend is a reward paid to the shareholders for their investment in a company's equity, and it usually originates from the company's net profits.

- Dividends are a form of distribution of profits to shareholders

Types of Dividends

Cash Dividends

Cash dividends are the most common type of dividend. They are paid out in the form of cash directly to shareholders.

 Cash dividends provide investors with immediate income that can be used for personal expenses or reinvested.



Stock Dividends

In addition to cash dividends, companies may also issue stock dividends. Instead of paying cash, shareholders receive additional shares of stock in proportion to their existing holdings..

 If a company declares a 10% stock dividend, shareholders receive 10 additional shares for every 100 shares they own.



Special Dividends

These dividends are usually declared when a company has excess cash or experiences exceptional financial success.

 Special dividends can be larger than regular dividends and provide an extra boost of income to shareholders.
